## **PREFACE**

The research on the ancient and Byzantine harbour city of Ainos in Thrace, its history, function and structure has been since the beginning one of the methodological and analytic highlights of our Priority Research Programme (SPP 1630) »Harbours from the Roman Imperial Period to the Middle Ages«, funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG). Historical, classical archaeological, Byzantine and field archaeological research approaches were initiated and successfully carried out in Ainos in a multidisciplinary context. This is all the more a reason to appreciate the dedication of all those who were since the beginning of the SPP »Harbours« involved in the research of Ainos and its environment for over ten years and have thus been able to achieve surprising and sustainable results. In 2016, an interdisciplinary workshop was held to present the important results of the Ainos project in a wider regional context.
